

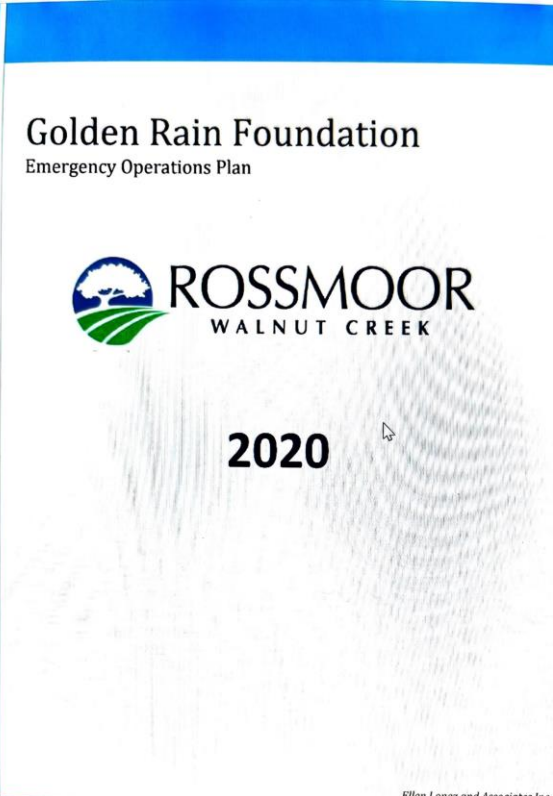
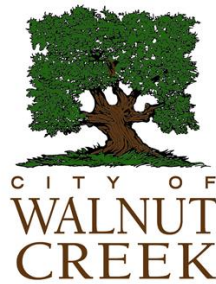
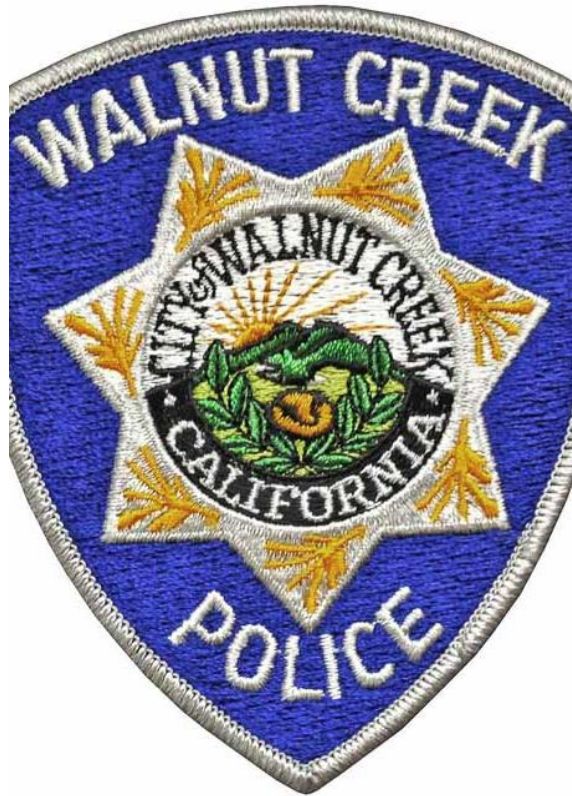

- Goats

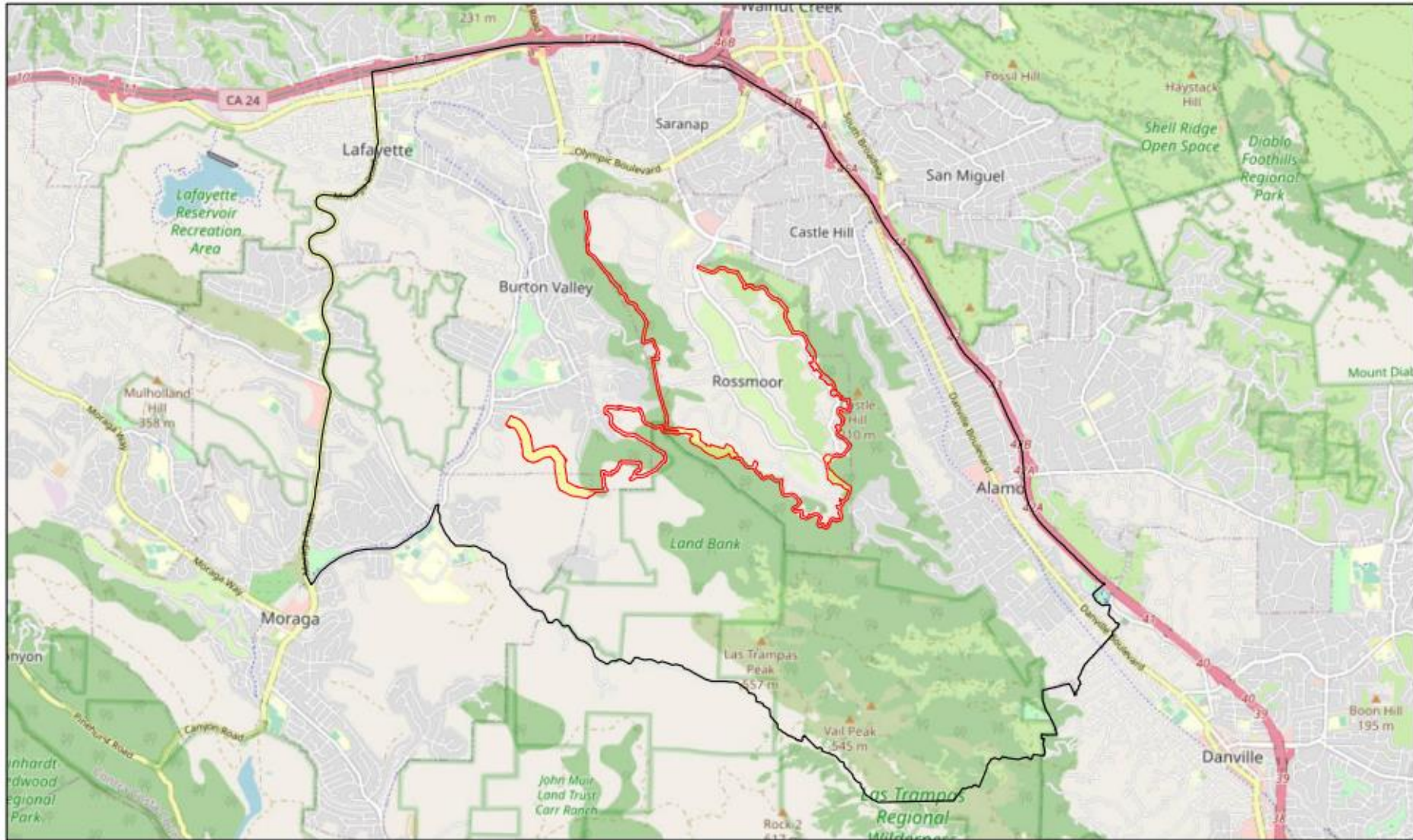

Fuel Break







Lafayette/Walnut Creek Shaded Fuel Break

Get Ready (Pack Valuables Including Important Documents)

- Get to know your neighbors and make plans to help each other in case of a wildfire evacuation.
- Create and maintain defensible space and harden your home against flying embers.
- Prepare your family and home ahead of time for the possibility of having to evacuate.
- Choose an out-of-area friend or relative as a check-in contact; Write their phone number on the phone list inside.
- Have an escape plan; Know where to meet your family, what to take, and where to go.
- Ask friends or relatives outside your area if you would be able to stay with them, should the need arise. Check with hotels, motels, and campgrounds to learn if they are open.

Get Set (Monitor News Reports and Follow Directions from Public Safety Officials)

- Review your Evacuation Checklist.
- Alert family and neighbors.
- Dress in appropriate clothing (Cotton clothing is best-long pants, long sleeved shirt, hat, face cover.)
- Ensure that you have a Grab n' Go Bag that includes all necessary items, such as battery powered radio, spare batteries, emergency contact numbers, and ample drinking water.
- Tune in to any local radio or TV station for updates and information.
- Remain close to your house and keep an eye on your family and pets until you are ready to leave.

Go (Evacuate Now. Look for Information on Resources and Support)

The terms "Voluntary" and "Mandatory" are used to describe evacuation orders. However, local jurisdictions may use other terminology such as "Precautionary" and "Immediate Threat." These terms are used to alert you to the significance of the danger. All evacuation instructions provided by officials should be followed immediately for your safety.

- In an intense wildfire, they may not have time to knock on every door.
- Leave any time that you do not feel safe.
- If you are advised to evacuate your area, don't hesitate, leave immediately!
- Cover up to protect against heat and flying embers. Wear long pants, long sleeve shirt, heavy shoes/boots, cap, N^o or face cover, goggles or glasses. 100% cotton is preferable.
- Locate your pets and take them with you.
- Follow direction from public safety officials.
- Evacuating early also helps firefighters keep roads clear of congestion and lets them move more freely.
- You may be directed to temporary assembly areas to await transfer to a safe location.

What to do if You Become Trapped

While in your home:

- Stay calm and keep your family together.
- Call 911 and inform authorities of your location.
- Fill sinks and tubs with cold water.
- Keep doors and windows closed but unlocked.
- Stay inside your house.
- Stay away from outside walls and windows.

While in your vehicle:


- Stay calm.
- Park your vehicle in an open area.
- Close all vehicle windows.
- Cover yourself with a blanket or heavy clothing.
- Lie on vehicle floor.
- Use your cell phone if safe to do so.

While on foot:

- Stay calm.
- Go to an area of level ground.
- Lie face down.
- Use a blanket or heavy clothing to cover yourself.

What to do if You Become Trapped

While in your home:

- Stay calm and keep your family together.
- Call 911 and inform authorities of your location.
- Fill sinks and tubs with cold water.
- Keep doors and windows closed but unlocked.
- Stay inside your house.
- Stay away from outside walls and windows.

While in your vehicle:

- Stay calm.
- Park your vehicle in an area clear of vegetation.
- Close all vehicle windows and vents.
- Cover yourself with a wool or cotton blanket or jacket.
- Lie on vehicle floor.
- Use your cell phone to advise officials—Call 911.

While on foot:

- Stay calm.
- Go to an area clear of vegetation, a ditch or depression on level ground if possible. (Golf Course)
- Lie face down and cover up your body.
- Use your cell phone to Call 911.

FIRE EVACUATION KNOW YOUR ZONE

When to Evacuate

Leave as soon as evacuation is recommended by fire officials

- ✓ Officials will determine the areas to be evacuated and escape routes to use depending upon the fire's location, behavior, winds, terrain, etc.
- ✓ Law enforcement agencies are typically responsible for enforcing an evacuation order. Follow their directions promptly. You will be advised of potential evacuations as early as possible. You must take the initiative to stay informed and aware. Listen to your radio/TV for announcements from law enforcement and emergency personnel.

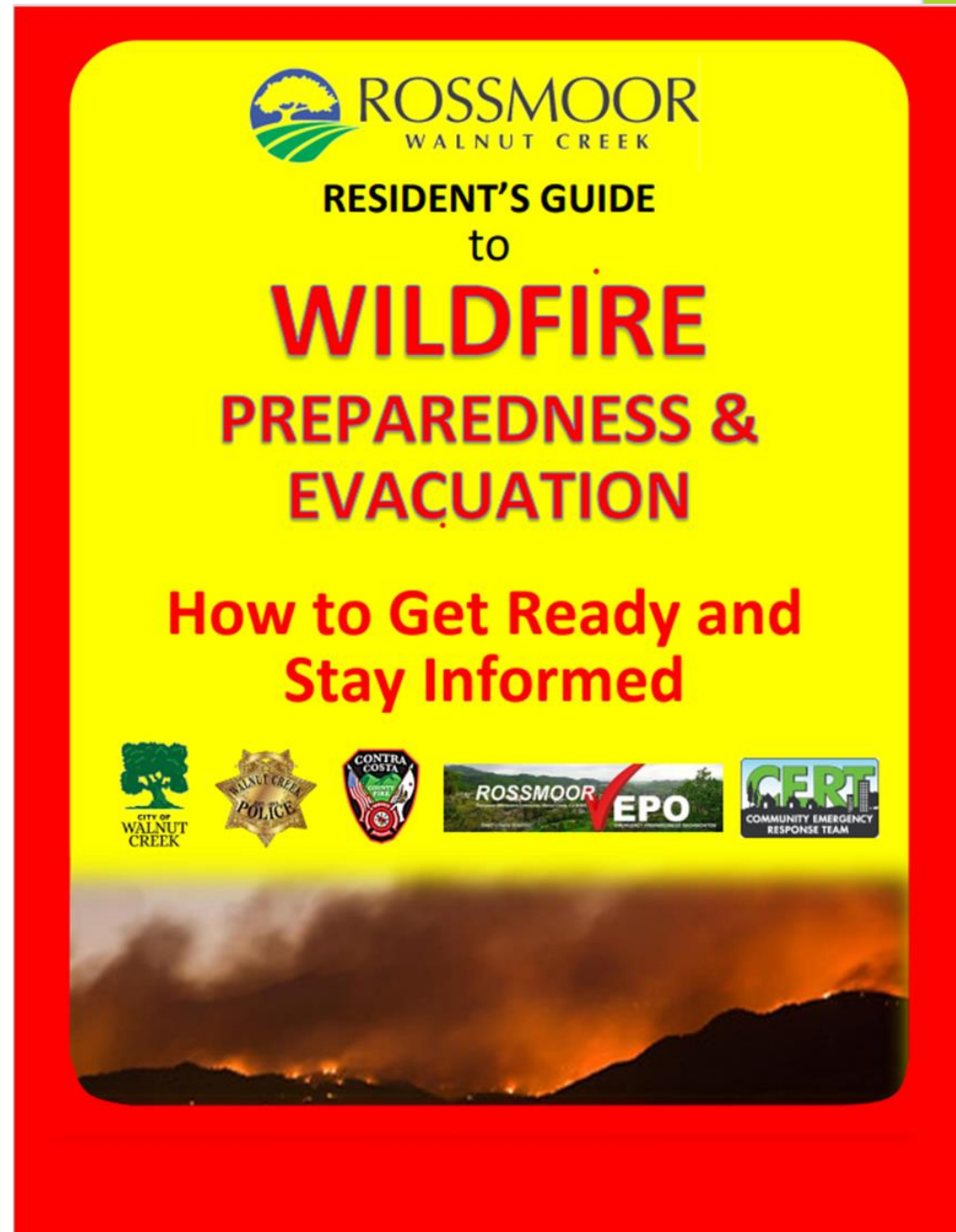

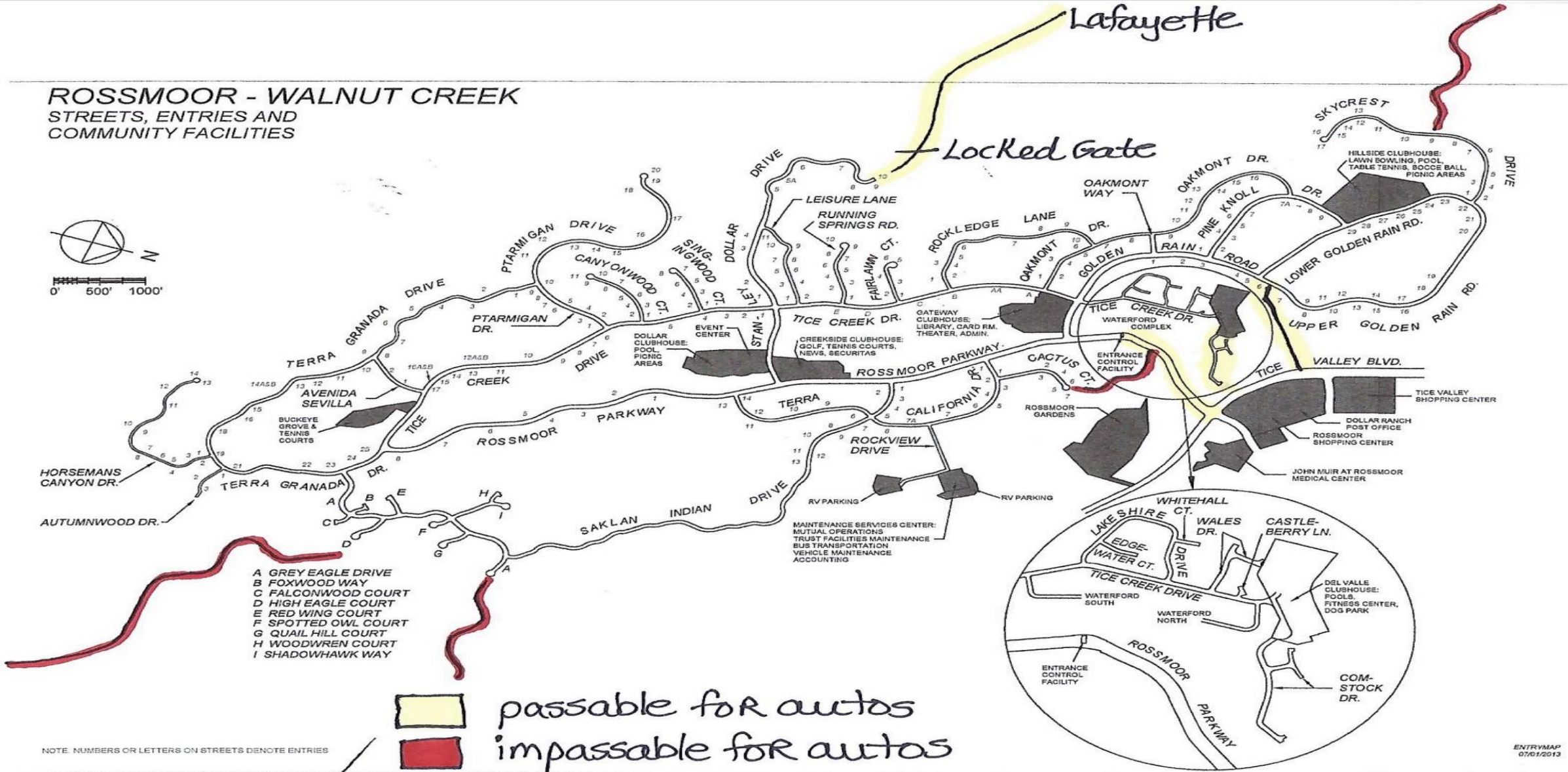
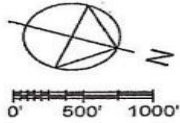


Emergency Access Roads and Emergency Evacuation Roads

- ▶ **Event occurs: Alerts begin**
 - ▶ **Self Evacuation**
 - ▶ **Voluntary Evacuation**
 - ▶ **Nixle, CWS, Zonehaven, Local News**
 - ▶ **Mandatory Evacuation**
 - ▶ **Nixle, CWS, Zonehaven, Local News, Police Public Address systems, Police Door to Door**
 - ▶ **Police traffic control**
 - ▶ **Road closures/Zones**
 - ▶ **Counter flow**
 - ▶ **Location to go to**
